SECOND: PROFESSIONAL INFORMATION COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course covers examining the material characteristics of knitwear and its relevance to woven fabric. It includes the knit pattern drafting method necessary for the knitwear fabrication process and patterns by considering the design characteristics and the physical properties of knitwear.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

After studying this course, the student is expected to be able to achieve the following objectives:

- Develop patterns suitable for knitted clothing.
- Understand the difference between patterns and sewing methods when making fabric wear and knit wear.
- Develop various clothes by applying a knit pattern.
